



CPR & Defibrillator Program Launch in the Delta School District

On Monday, November 9th at 10:00AM, the ACT Foundation will be launching their CPR & Defibrillator Program within the Delta School District.

With this initiative, 1,500 students will learn how to perform CPR and how to use a defibrillator every year. Defibrillators will also be donated to the schools that need it for cardiac arrest emergencies.

The ACT High School CPR & Defibrillator Program is built on a strong community-based model of partnerships and support. Partnering with ACT are RBC, AstraZeneca Canada, Pfizer Canada and Sanofi Canada, who are donating CPR and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) training mannequins, AED training units that the Delta secondary schools need to set up the program. BC Emergency Health Services (BCEHS) paramedics are providing training to the teachers as instructors. Starting this school year, teachers are to teach CPR and defibrillation skills to their students as a regular part of the curriculum, reaching all youth prior to graduation.
